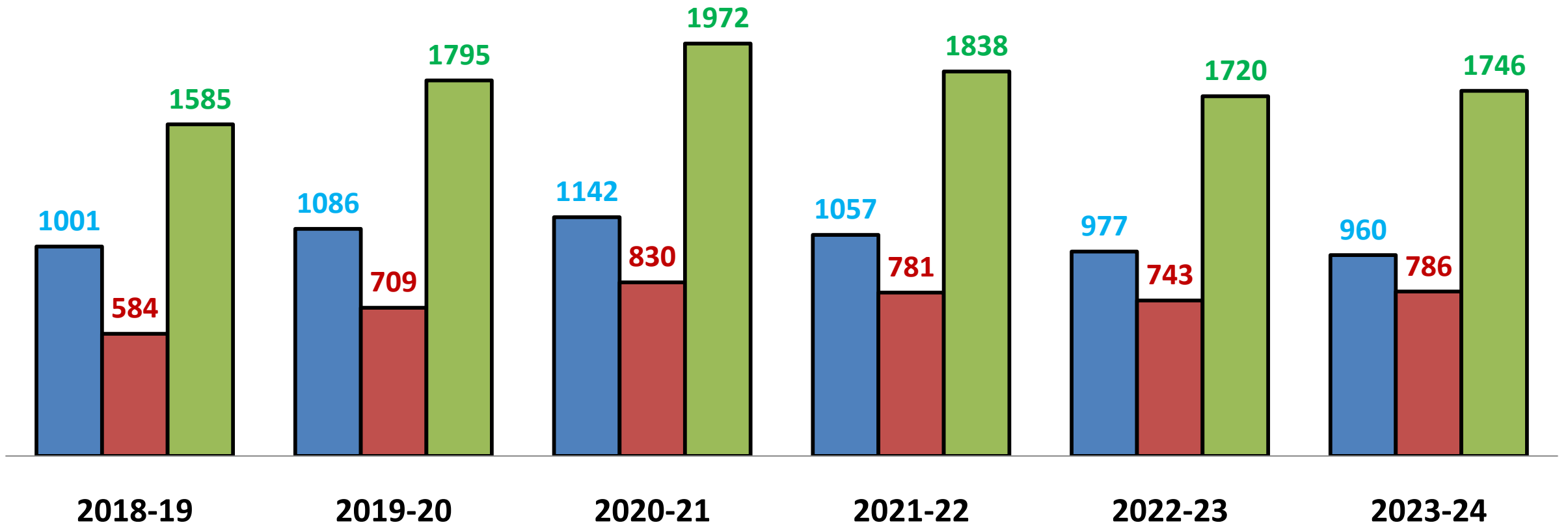


# GENDER WISE ENROLLED STUDENT
